A request has been made to the committee that we try to leave the car parking spaces behind the church for people with disabilities and try to park closer to one another to accommodate more vehicles. Currently there is a shortage of street parking due to the expansion of the Vegetable Scheme in the Church Hall nearby. We are unable to do anything about this, and encourage members to maybe get dropped off if they have difficulty walking.
