Debbie Munro is Associate Professor in the Department of Mechanical Engineering at the University of Canterbury.

As well as leading the Biomedical Engineering course, she also serves as faculty advisor for the Biomedical Engineering Club and manages the work experience programme for biomedical engineering students in the Pacific Islands.

Her research focuses on medical devices, biomechanics and diagnostic sensors designed to enhance peoples' lives. Throughout much of her career she has worked in the orthopaedic implant industry, designing implants and instruments for hip and knee replacement surgery. Her research interests include advancing systems for training personnel in developing countries on the repair and maintenance of medical devices.
